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

WHAT SERVICES ARE OFFERED?

Public assistance program applications:

SNAP Benefits: Food assistance for individuals or families that meet program guidelines. Expedited processing is available within 7 days of application if you meet program requirements. If you are receiving three meals a day, you do not qualify for SNAP benefits.

Aid to the Needy and Disabled (AND): Cash assistance program for those with a qualifying disability.

Adult Medicaid: Medicaid for Working Adults with a disability or Adults without dependent children.

Old Age Pension (OAP): Is a cash assistance program for clients at least 60 years old, without any income.

General Assistance Services:

Food Vouchers: Outreach workers may issue King Soopers vouchers in limited circumstances.

Pharmacy vouchers: Emergency pharmacy vouchers can be issued for mandatory prescriptions, if no other resource is available. The vouchers are only good at King Soopers pharmacies. Narcotics are not eligible.

RTD Bus tickets: Outreach Staff will issue a one way ride for clients that completed an application for General Assistance or other services at an outreach office.

Family Reunification: Greyhound bus tickets for homeless clients only if they meet eligibility requirements.

Eviction assistance, deposit, first month's rent, mortgage, storage, and Xcel assistance: Financial assistance is available to individuals and families who have a verifiable emergency preventing them from being able to pay rent and are able to demonstrate the ability to maintain the expense.

Emergency Shelter: Outreach staff will assist homeless families, single women, those in need of respite, and the disabled secure an emergency bed or room through the various shelter programs.

Respite Program: Respite beds are issued to homeless clients discharged from specific hospitals. Referrals are issued by Social Work staff or Doctors only.

Burial Program: Burial assistance is available to Denver residents that do not have sufficient funds for burial or cremation. Assistance is based on all resources and income.

INTRO TO COMMUNITY HOUSING

TYPES OF HOUSING IN THE COMMUNITY:

There are four main housing options in the community that are discussed here. The terms "Affordable Housing" "Subsidized", "Low-income" and "Section 8" are often confused so we will try to describe each one.

- 1. Section 8 is run by local public housing authorities (PHA), and funded by HUD (Housing and Urban Development). Public Housing Authorities are typically run by cities and counties and manage their own project based buildings but also offer Housing Choice Vouchers (HCV). A Housing Choice Voucher is a voucher that a person is awarded and they can take that voucher out into the community and rent an apartment or house from a landlord. The landlord will receive rent from the leaser at 30% of their adjusted gross income, and HUD will subsidize the remainder of the rent. Vouchers are highly desirable and typically are given out based on a lottery system. Each housing authority manages their own lottery system, and sometimes opens the lottery system only two days of the year. Public Housing Authorities also manage individual "project based sites" in the community. Some of the sites focus only on elderly and or the disabled and some will allow anyone to move in (singles, families, disabled, etc). You can usually place your name on these lists via each Housing Authority but sometimes those waitlists will close due to being too long. Project Based Housing means the voucher stays with the unit and not with the individual.
- 2. People usually think the only way to access subsidized housing is through public housing authorities listed above, which is not accurate. Low-income or subsidized housing is another type of housing offered in the community. These are privately owned apartment buildings that have decided to become HUD funded. These would also be "project based" as the subsidy stays with each unit, in other words you do not need a "voucher" to apply. There are hundreds of these sites in the Denver metro area that can be accessed directly by the applicant. These sites sometimes only specialize in elderly/and or disabled, families, or all ages. Elderly is either considered 55 years or older or 62 years or older, depending on the site. Some sites will even require applicants be 65 years or older. Disability can be strictly mobility impaired, mental health or medical disabilities. Many sites focus on families and will only offer 2-4 bedrooms and these waitlists can be quite long. Subsidized housing is sometimes run by non-profit agencies like Colorado Coalition for the Homeless, Archdiocesan Housing or Mercy Housing, to name a few. Other sites are privately owned by individuals or even by property developers (Brother's Redevelopment). All of these sites have their own leasing office and can be contacted for an application. Many of the sites will also close their waitlist temporarily due to excessive applicants.

- 3. Affordable Housing Tax Credit is the third type of housing that will be discussed. The term "affordable housing" refers to properties that receive a "tax credit" from HUD for their rental units. This large tax credit in turn allows them to offer affordable rental units to the community. The actual program is called Low Income Housing Tax Credits (LIHTC) and is run by HUD also. Each year HUD allocates a set dollar amount to each state to offer to existing properties or property developers. A property has to apply for these tax credits and meet all eligibility criteria for the tax credit. The rents for these units are based on a person's percentage of the Area Median Income (AMI), and all have set rents. The rents will fall between the area of Market rate prices and low-income housing prices. These units are ideal for applicants that have income higher than a typical pension rate, someone with a high SSDI payment, or someone working but not making enough for a market rate apartment. Affordable/Tax Credit housing is becoming more and more available in the community.
- 4. Market Rate Housing is the fourth type of housing being discussed here. This is just your standard rental unit in the community. Some websites that have both affordable tax credit and market rate housing are listed below

Calling About at Apartment: Checklist of Housing & Questions to ask when calling apartment buildings

- 1. Proof of income if applicable. This includes AND, SSDI, SSI, VA Pension, etc. What sort of proof of income do you require when I apply? Remember you can apply to "subsidized" housing with zero income.
- 2. Identification Colorado ID, Birth Certificate, social security card. You should ask up front so you can begin collecting documents. It's safe to assume you will need all of these, especially for HUD funded properties. Colorado ID Project can help acquire these documents.
- 3. If you have children, ask what type of proof of custody do I need? To apply for family subsidized housing you must have 50% or more custody of children in the household.
- 4. Disability some subsidized sites will not ask for proof of a disability until a unit is available for the applicant. Other sites will ask for proof of disability to be provided along with the initial application. Proof of receiving SSDI, SSI or NSC Pension is not enough evidence for HUD, so they will ask that a mental health or medical provider sign a form verifying that you have a disability. You should ask this up front so you know ahead how to complete these documents later.
- 5. Criminal All subsidized and tax credit sites will run a criminal background check so it is good to be aware of what is on your record. Ask them how far back they go for felonies and misdemeanors. Some sites are stricter than others. Most are looking for recent charges of drug or violent types of crimes. You can still apply to any subsidized housing and <u>if denied you have the right to appeal within 14 days</u>. There are two charges/convictions that cannot be appealed which are: lifetime requirement of registering as a sex offender and production of methamphetamines.
- 6. Housing History/Landlord references. Ask them how many years of landlord rental history do they require? Do they accept anyone with an eviction on their record? What if I have an eviction but I don't owe them any money?
- 7. Pets Applicants cannot be denied admission due to a "service animal", but it must be a verifiable service animal. In recent years there have been new terms introduced and those include "companion animal", "therapy animal", or "emotional support animal". These terms also fall under the reasonable accommodation act but will still need a letter of support from either a licensed mental health provider or a medical doctor. It is important to know that "emotional support" or "companion animal" are not considered "service animal", but again are still considered to be an "assistive animal". If the animal is a "service animal" then the landlord cannot ask for a deposit by law. This still means the owner of the service animal is responsible for any damages after they leave the apartment. If it is an "emotional support or companion animal", they can still ask for a deposit up front.
- 8. Move in costs Subsidized housing is 30% of your income for rent, and security deposit is always the same as that rent. Subsidized housing cannot ask for application fees and clients should always be cautious of any "holding fees". Affordable/tax credit housing will have larger deposit amounts and will more than likely have application fees. Ask them about move-in costs listed above.

Treatment is provided there (tx is not substance abuse specific) but can include relapse prevention. There two homes for men and one home for women. Rent is approx. \$450/mo for a private room and includes all utilities. You can apply with no income as they will offer you a "gradual increase" in rent and will help clients find work. Usually take referrals from parole or probation officers, but will take direct referrals from Veterans.

Ebenezer House

4780 & 4782 Williams St. Provides transitional housing for men recently released from sober living treatment facilities, half-way house situations, or others who are transitioning into community life with an emphasis on Veterans' needs. Must be on parole. This is a faith-based program and has access to drug and alcohol recovery services. Ebenezer House comprises 3 separate dwellings with 6 apartments that can house 4 to 5 men in each building. Each apartment shares a laundry, TV room and locked bicycle storage. Weekly rent is \$125 per week, single bedroom. Rent must be paid in advance; meals not included and must be able to live well with others. No registered sex offenders or violent felons.



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The federal **Fair Housing Act** was signed into law on April 11, 1968, just days after the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Amended in 1988, the act prohibits discrimination in the provision of housing and housing-related services (insurance, loans, appraisals) on the basis of **race, color, national origin, familial status** (families with children under the age of 18 or families expecting a child), **sex, religion or disability**.

Under the Fair Housing Act, it is illegal to treat someone differently because of their race, ethnicity, disability or other characteristic protected by this law. The following are examples of how a housing provider might discriminate:

- · Refuse to rent or sell housing
- · Refuse to negotiate for housing
- Say housing is unavailable when it is in fact available
- Make housing unavailable in other ways
- · Charge more for the same housing or service
- Set different terms, conditions, or privileges
- Provide different housing services or facilities
- Persuade owners to sell or rent for profit, a tactic known as blockbusting
- · Refuse to make reasonable accommodations for a disabled person to use the housing
- Refuse to allow a disabled person to make reasonable modification to his/her dwelling
- Fail to design or construct housing in an accessible manner, contingent on date the property was built.
- Threaten or interfere with anyone making a fair housing complaint
- Deny homeowners insurance or set different pricing, terms or conditions for insurance
- Provide false information about mortgage loans, deny a mortgage loan, or impose different pricing, terms or conditions on a mortgage loan

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
